**What types of activities are included in MICCD?** MICCD provides young people four ways to experience construction:

1. Information Booths: Sponsored by colleges, universities and other industry organizations providing information on various construction careers.
2. Hands-On Activities: Sponsored by companies and skilled-trades organizations. These activities include, but not limited to; wood cutting and nailing, copper pipe sweating, electrical wire pulling, masonry, heavy equipment repair, wind-turbines demonstrations, etc.
3. Large Outdoor Displays: Includes static heavy equipment, construction vehicles, solar arrays, or other types of construction related displays.
4. Active Heavy Equipment: Pieces of heavy equipment that the young people can actually operate, i.e. backhoes, excavators, wheeled loaders, pavers, rollers, motor graders, hi-lows, aerial lifts.

**How can I get involved in MICCD 2010?** Just as it takes many trades to build a house, a road or a hospital, it takes many companies and organizations to build Michigan's construction workforce. Only by coming together as an industry, putting our best effort forth as one group, can we hope to attract and train our future construction workforce.
